ENCROACHMENT FORMS

If your home currently has a fence that is connected to an existing CDD wall or structure, you are in violation as your fence can only be on your property line and not connect to CDD property.

To counter this– The CDD board has agreed to allow homeowners to encroach the small piece of land that goes up to the CDD fence. All you need is to sign an encroachment agreement, and the ACC will attach the agreement to your fence application in the system and file with Hillsborough county that the CDD is granting you that piece of lot.

You can pick up an Encroachment Form from the Manager's office at the Clubhouse. The board will review your property and process it to be filled and attached to your property.

Did You Know?



Consumers can purchase qualifying back-to-school supplies exempt from tax during the 2021 Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday. Passed by the Florida Legislature and signed into law by Gov. Ron DeSantis, the sales tax holiday begins Saturday, July 31 and extends through Monday, August 9. The Department of Revenue created this webpage to provide information and promotional materials for consumers, businesses, and other interested parties.

During this sales tax holiday period, Florida law directs that no sales tax or local option tax (also known as discretionary sales surtax) will be collected on:

- purchases of clothing, footwear, and certain accessories selling for \$60 or less per item,
- purchases of certain school supplies selling for \$15 or less per item, and

• the first \$1,000 of the sales price of personal computers and certain computer-related accessories, when purchased for non commercial home or personal use.

This sales tax holiday does not apply to:

- Any item of clothing selling for more than \$60;
- Any school supply item selling for more than \$15;
- Books that are not otherwise exempt;
- Computers and computer-related accessories purchased for commercial purposes;
- Rentals or leases of any eligible items;
- Repairs or alterations of any eligible items; or
- Sales of any eligible items in a theme park, entertainment complex, public lodging establishment, or airport.

Reference: Section 43, Chapter 2021-31, Laws of Florida.

Riverview conservation park advances as temporary road closure sought.

Notice has been issued for a 90-day road closure, starting in September and related to construction for the upcoming Riverview/Alafia River conservation park off Riverview Drive between Interstate 75 and U.S. 301. County officials seek public comment concerning the temporary road closure, which is for the slice of Riverview Drive between Dean Street and Albyar Avenue as work advances on the 27-acre site for the riverfront park.

More specifically, the work involves construction of a traffic roundabout for increased safety near the park's entrance. County officials have said modern roundabouts effectively reduce speeds below 25 miles per hour, which helps to "eliminate most lethal crashes, such as T -bone and head-on crashes that can occur at conventional intersections." Slower speeds, they contend, "also benefit all other users of the roundabout, including pedestrians, bicyclists, skateboarders, children and the elderly."

The public engagement period is set to last through July 19. After that, concerned people can sign up to speak on the issue at the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners board meeting Aug. 4. To sign up, visit <u>www.HCFLGov.net/SpeakUp</u>. As for the upcoming park itself, it's been described as a "passive park," which means most of the land's features will be left undisturbed, with a vegetative buffer of trees along the western edge of the property. Open areas will feature plants native to the area. Scheduled amenities for park-goers include wooded picnic areas with shelters and restrooms, paved parking, a walking trail and an observation tower to provide bird's-eye views of the Alafia River. A similar 37-foot, wooden observation tower, offering stunning sunset views of both the Tampa and St. Petersburg skylines, opened in September at the Apollo Beach Nature Preserve. Like the Apollo Beach preserve, at 6760 Surfside Blvd., the Riverview/Alafia Park is set to open sunrise to sunset. In related action, Hillsborough County commissioners at their April 7 meeting approved a public artwork sculpture for the upcoming Riverview/Alafia River park. Approved is Daniel Horse Chief's proposal for a 6-foot high bronze sculpture of a Seminole mother and child. Featuring a panther as well, it's set to be mounted on a 6-foot high rock base inside the Riverview/Alafia River Park. Construction is slated for early 2022.

Maintenance Tips

The Essential Guide to Hurricane Preparedness

Each year hurricane season begins on June 1st and lasts 5 months, with storms typically peaking in August and September. As with every hurricane season regardless of forecast, knowing the essentials of how to prepare could truly be a life saver. First, know your hurricane facts and understand common terms used during hurricane forecasts. Storm conditions can vary on the intensity, size and even the angle which the tropical cyclone approaches your area, so it is vital you understand what the forecasters and news reporters are telling you.

Tropical Depressions are cyclones with winds of 38 mph. **Tropical Storms** vary in wind speeds from 39-73 mph while **Hurricanes** have winds 74 mph and greater. Typically the upper right quadrant of the storm (the center wrapping around the eye) is the most intense portion of the storm. The greatest threats are damaging winds, storm surge and flooding. This is in part why Hurricane Katrina was so catastrophic when bringing up to 28 foot storm surges onto the Louisiana and Mississippi coastlines.

- Tropical Storm Watch: Tropical storm conditions are possible in the area.
- Hurricane Watch: Hurricane conditions are possible in the area. Watches are issued 48 hours in advance of the anticipated onset of tropical storm force winds.
- Tropical Storm Warning: Tropical storm conditions are expected in the area.
- Hurricane Warning: Hurricane conditions are expected in the area. Warnings are issued 36 hours in advance of tropical storm force winds.
- Eye: Clear, sometimes well-defined center of the storm with calmer conditions.
- Eye Wall: Surrounding the eye, contains some of the most severe weather of the storm with the highest wind speed and largest precipi tation.
- Rain Bands: Bands coming off the cyclone that produce severe weather conditions such as heavy rain, wind and tornadoes.
- Storm Surge: An often underestimated and deadly result of ocean water swelling as a result of a land falling storm, and quickly flooding coastal and sometimes areas further inland.
